All subscriptions are for a 12 week series. Global Issues Series I/II VOD is composed of 6 lectures from Series I and 6 lectures from Series II. See calendar at right for a list of the specific lectures.

The price for a single subscription is \$85. If you purchase a V0D subscription along with with a live performance subscription, you will receive a package discount. The price for the package is \$125. The V0D and live subscriptions must be in the same group. For example, live Music Monday (Sarasota or Venice) with Music Monday V0D.

The ticket website will show the discount and the package price when the second item of the pair has been added to the cart. The date shown on the ticket website is the date of the first lecture/performance of the season.
